Community Worship — An Encounter with the Holy



In today's climate of spiritual hunger, contemporary Christians are rediscovering corporate worship as a place to meet God—and to both express our devotion to God and to be formed in Christ by the power of Holy Spirit at work in us. We worship in word, song, dance, artistic imagination, prayer, and at the table of Christ. People at all stages of life are longing for worship that invites us to be participants in the story of God's reconciling mission in the world. How might we envision corporate worship in ways that move us toward full and active participation by everyone involved? Which worship practices are most life-giving and why? And how might our practice of the Lord's Supper offer us overlooked opportunities for coming close to Jesus? As society enters another time of cultural and spiritual reformation, how does our congregational worship root us in our faith tradition while allowing us to experience our risen Lord in new ways?

Sara Wenger Shenk, president of AMBS, will explore some perspectives on worship as our "primary theology" out of which everything else we do flows. She will also share her experience in an "experimental congregation" which practiced multiple ways of entering the story of Jesus' last supper with his disciples. Sara will speak theologically and pastorally about how worship is central to remembering who we are, whose we are, and how we are called to live in our daily life and work.



Sara Wenger Shenk's experiences in mission, church planting, teaching and administration have fostered a unique combination of leadership gifts. She was a member of the faculty and administration of Eastern Mennonite Seminary, Harrisonburg, Va., for 15 years prior to coming to AMBS in 2010. She and Gerald, her husband, served on study-service appointments with Eastern Mennonite Missions and Mennonite Central Committee in the former Yugoslavia from 1977–1983 and 1986–1989. In addition, Sara has served in conference and denominational leadership roles, and she has written extensively in both academic and church publications. During the last three years that she lived in Harrisonburg, she and Gerald were instrumental in leading The Table, an emerging Mennonite congregation in Harrisonburg, giving evidence to her emphasis that worship grounds all aspects of theological education.
