Directions to Amigo Centre
from Sturgis, Michigan

Go north on IN State Rt. 9 which is S. Centreville Road. Follow S. Centreville Rd. which eventually becomes N. Centreville Rd. after crossing MI 12 in Sturgis. Go north approximately 4 miles to Featherstone Rd. (N. Centreville comes to a T at the stop sign.) Turn right on Featherstone and go about 1/4 mile to Rommel Rd. At this point you will begin to see Amigo Centre signs. Turn left and go 1 mile to the stop. Turn left onto Banker Rd. and WATCH CAREFULLY FOR THE AMIGO CENTRE SIGN (not Amigo Park). Take the second left which is a continuation of Banker Rd. (If you pass the Christian school on your left, you missed the turn.) Follow Banker Rd. The drive for Amigo Centre will be on the left side about 1/2 mile after the final turn.

Cyneatha Millsaps is the Great Lakes Regional Program Director for Mennonite Central Committee. Mennonite Central Committee is an international relief and peace organization. She is responsible for domestic programming in

the areas of immigration, restorative justice, and relief work such as (providing relief kits for refugees and impoverished counties around the world).

Cyneatha is the lead pastor of a multicultural congregation just outside of Chicago, IL. She is working with multicultural churches in the Mennonite community providing education and information about the blessings and challenges of worshipping in diverse communities of faith. She has trained specifically in the area of dating and family violence and has spent several years working directly with victims of domestic violence.

Cyneatha is active in her local community; the founder of BAPS (Black American Princesses) a mentoring program for young African American females between the ages of 13-19. She is also a community activist and advocate on the needs of women and children in the areas of violence, education, and spiritual development.

Cyneatha is married to her loving husband of 25 years, Steven. Together they have seven children and twenty grandchildren.
